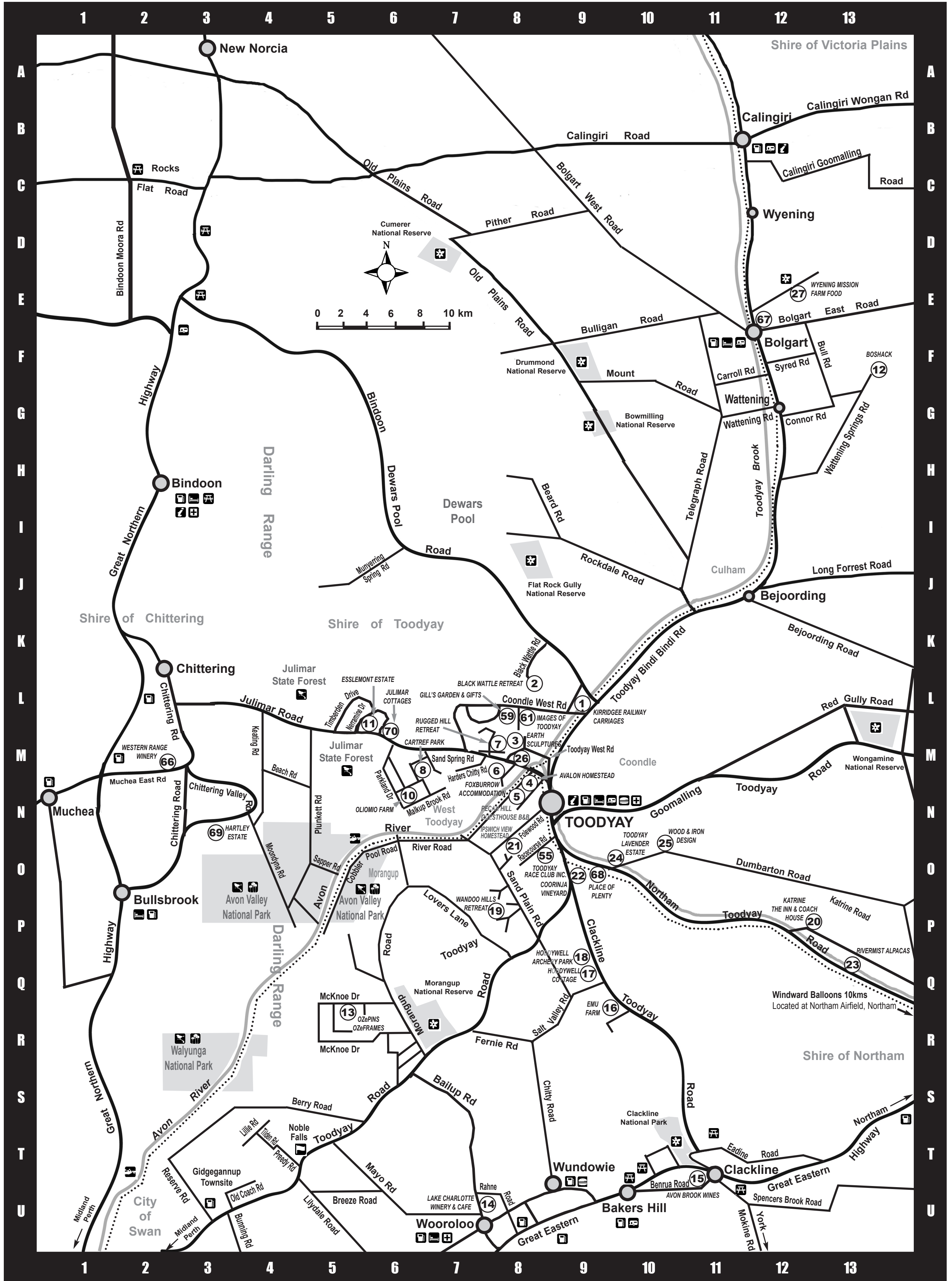

Toodyay: Living History

Toodyay offers the visitor Western Australia's quintessential example of early colonial village settlement in the magnificent hill country east of Perth. The town boasts some of the finest examples of 19th century architecture and historic sites in the State, vividly reflecting the early convict era in the region.

Founded by Ensign Dale in October 1831, the name Toodyay is derived from the Aboriginal word 'duigee' which means 'place of plenty'. The name relates to the richness and fertility of the area and the reliability of waters from the Avon River.

The original settlement was established on the Avon some five kilometres west of the present town. However that area flooded badly in the wet season, and in 1860 it was decided to move to the present town site. The town was then named "Newcastle". In 1911 the original name of Toodyay was adopted to avoid confusion with the town of Newcastle in NSW.

The ever-changing Avon River meanders through the region. It greatly enhances the beauty of the area, which is ideal for a day trip, weekend sojourn or longer visit.

The township is surrounded by beautiful country gardens, lavender fields, olive groves, historic

wine cellars, an emu farm and colonial-era tea shops - all making the region perfect for a relaxing stop-over. All this is an easy 85km drive north-east of Perth on Toodyay Road, only an hour away!

Toodyay also is home to many resident artisans and their works can be viewed in galleries, local businesses and the Visitor Centre. Accommodation ranges from charming bed and breakfasts to five star luxury. Camping and caravan parks are also available throughout the area.

The locals like nothing better than a great event and among others celebrate the wildflowers in spring, the Moodyne Festival on the first Sunday in May, the exciting white water Avon Descent in August and the Avon Valley Spring Chamber Music Festival in October.

Toodyay boasts several lovely parks, picnic areas and children's facilities on the Avon River for relaxation. There's even a miniature train ride for the young- and the young at heart! Check running times with the Visitor Centre.

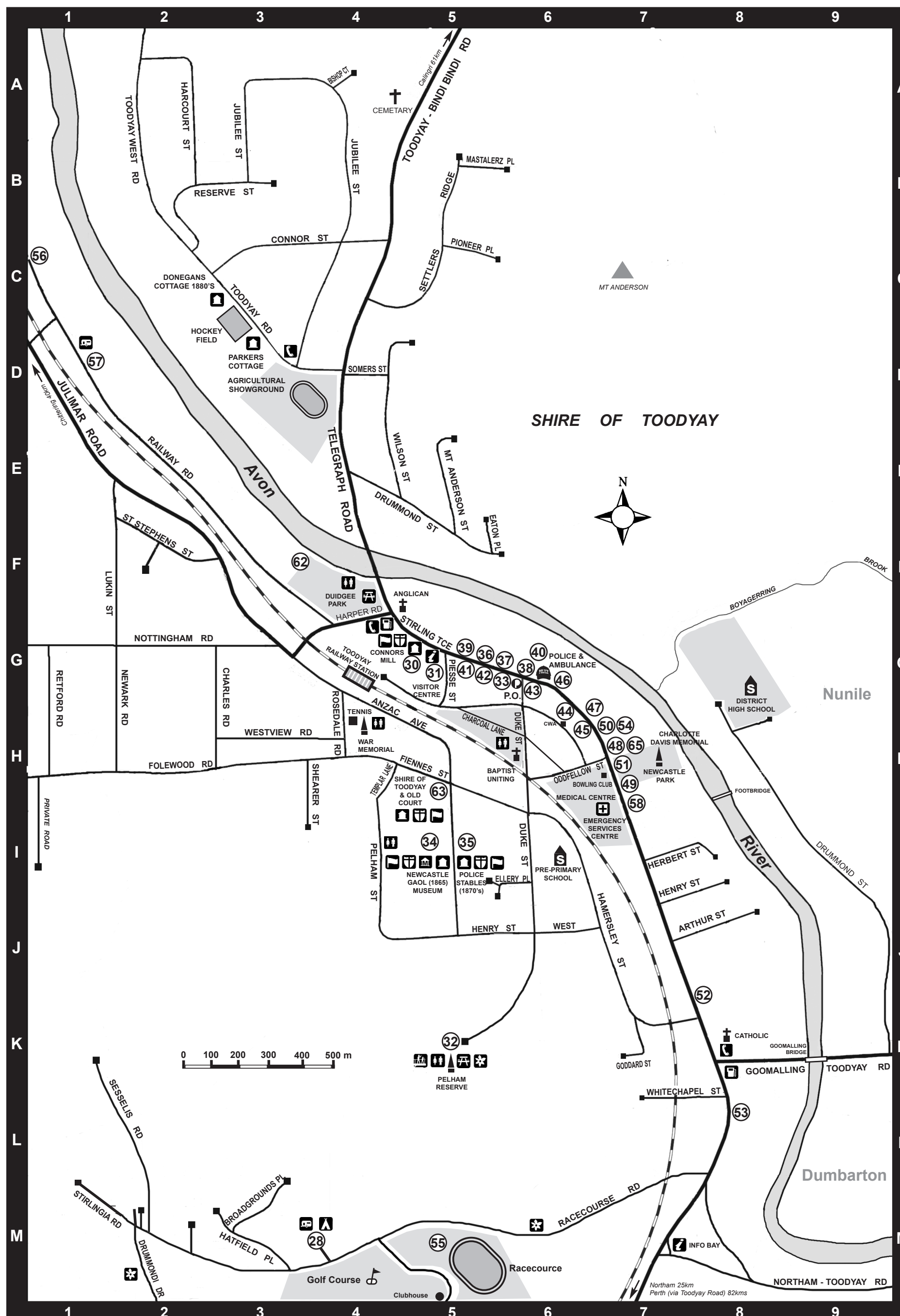

Historic Charm & Stunning Natural Beauty

Toodyay was classified a National Trust town in 1980 and was only the fourth town in Western Australia to be given this special recognition. Toodyay's long history from early settlement to the present day gives it a wonderful quality of genuineness. Many of its historic buildings continue to be used as a functioning part of the town, and great care has been taken over the years to retain the authenticity of its architecture, streetscapes and vistas. Truly a cultural and historic jewel set in the glorious undulating heart of the pristine Avon Valley, Toodyay offers a unique country experience. No matter what season you decide to visit there is always something to see or do in this renowned Western Australian town.

Historic Town Walk

Take in the fascinating architecture and Toodyay's rich history by following the documented Town Walk. This fun and informative stroll through the township is the best way to get a sense of times gone by in one of the State's most charming colonial settlements. Enjoy the tranquillity and unique sites on this memorable trail of discovery.

Connor's Mill

Arguably one of WA's most historic buildings, Connor's Mill is a must see when in Toodyay. The mill was built between 1870 - 1917 and was initially a steam driven facility. From 1917 - 1955 the mill housed a generator to supply power to the town. In 1921 a major fire destroyed all machinery within the powerhouse, and the following year the Road Board assumed control of the power service and it became the generator providing lighting to the town from 4pm to midnight seven nights a week. In 1975 the Shire of Toodyay protected the future of the building and with the assistance of funding from O'Connor Quinlan Estates and the Australian Heritage Commission, Connor's Mill was restored. A visit to see the magnificent working steam engine and to read about the history of this wonderful building is a must. Opening times: Seven days a week 9:00am to 5:00pm.

Old Gaol Museum

Built in the 1860s when the Resident Magistrate was enraged by notorious bushranger Moondyne Joe's daring escape from a previous lock-up, the Old Gaol now provides an atmospheric reminder of wilder colonial times gone by. Opening times: Weekends 10:00am to 4:00pm. Week days 10:00am to 3:00pm. Group visits by appointment.

Toodyay Pioneer Heritage Trail

The Toodyay Pioneer Heritage Trail is a 20km drive retracing the route taken by the first settlers in the area. The Trail runs from what is now Toodyay Road to Toodyay, via the old West Toodyay townsite. The trail offers a pleasant, leisurely two hour drive with opportunities for picnicking and bushwalking. Be sure to pick up a Trail map from the Toodyay Visitor Centre.

Cemeteries

For a small town, Toodyay has seven cemeteries dotted throughout the town area and history is relived when wandering through these resting places seeking out familiar names and those of relations.

Ye Olde Lolly Shoppe

Take a further step back in time and travel down memory lane as you enjoy all those forgotten lollies from yesteryear! Old-style English lollies, authentic humbugs and memorabilia collected for over 50 years or more. There is also signage that has not been seen in decades.

Avon Valley National Park

The Avon Valley National Park is situated 26kms west of Toodyay. The park features forests and granite outcrops with panoramic views of the Avon Valley and provides the opportunity to see a wide variety of birds and wildlife. Basic camping and picnic facilities are available within the National Park and you can enjoy time by the Avon River or a leisurely stroll through the bush. The park is the northern limit of jarrah forests. A great spot to get away from it all.

Julimar State Forest

The Julimar Conservation Park is concerned with the management of wildlife and the natural environment to preserve the area for science and posterity. There is large scale aerial 1080 fox baiting that occurs throughout Julimar as part of the CALM Western Shield Program. CALM conducts annual trapping and fauna monitoring operations in the area. Animals such as quenda, chuditch and brush tail possums are now relatively common in the area thanks to the success of the baiting program and some subsequent translocations. There are no developed recreation sites or trails in the area although the public is allowed to access the main tracks and roads through the area as long as they stay to designated tracks.
